Dear Parents,

In the chart below you will find this year's API scores disaggregated by our significant subgroups, i.e. groups with more than 100 students. The story told by these numbers is not the story we would write, if given the opportunity to write the perfect story. The perfect story would be one of growth in all categories with greater growth made among students of our African American, Hispanic, English Learners and Socioeconomic groups to close our achievement gap. The story would be one of all students achieving and exceeding an API score of 800.

These scores raise a number of questions for which we must continue to find answers, including the most obvious one of why did some students lose ground and others gain, when large numbers of students from all groups sought help after school. We have support systems in place capable of rewriting this story, IF we work together to ensure more students take advantage of them. We will help you, and in turn we ask you to help us. You can help us by:

- Ensuring your student misses no more than 9 days of school this year;
- Checking to be sure your student is working on homework every night;
- Checking Aeries regularly to find out what your student's grade is and whether or not he/she has any missing assignments;
- Printing the list of missing assignments and insisting your student complete them;
- Emailing your student's teacher once a week to check on your student's participation and homework in classes for which you are unhappy with your student's progress;
- Expecting your student to seek additional help from his/her teachers at lunch and/or afterschool and to follow up to make sure he/she went.

We will help you by:

- Updating Aeries regularly;
- Providing support systems for students who are not succeeding;
- Putting you in touch with the support systems available on campus;
- Being available at lunch and after school to help students in need;
- Replying to your emails within 48 hours.

As a reminder, the target Academic Performance Indicator (API) score is 800, and the goal is for all students to achieve at equally high rates.

To acknowledge our students' accomplishments we will once again be presenting STAR cards to students who scored proficient OR advanced OR improved their score by at least one band on at least one or all of the four STAR tests. Students can earn up to four stars, which may be redeemed for:

- Detention Waiver
- 1 hour early release at Saturday School
- \$5.00 off the price of a bid to Winter Formal, Senior Ball or Prom
- \$2.00 or 20% discount at the Student Store
- Free admission to a football or basketball game
- Classroom incentives agreed upon by teachers of each course

The STAR cards will be distributed to students before the end of 1st quarter.

The GREAT news is that we have other pieces of information that demonstrate to us that many students are achieving and taking pride in that achievement.

Honor Roll

Last year we began formally recognizing our students through a 3-tiered Honor Roll program. Students receive a certificate marking their accomplishment and their names are printed in the student newspaper, *The Lincolnian*. Below are the GPA breakdowns and the number of students earning this recognition for Semester 2 of 2010-2011.

- Principal's Honor Roll = 366 Students
GPA of 3.8 and above
- Trojan Honor Roll with Distinction = 255 Students
GPA of 3.5 to 3.79
- Trojan Honor Roll = 458 Students
GPA of 3.0 to 3.49

44% of our students fell into one of these 3 categories, which is outstanding! These certificates were distributed to students in their English classes during the week of September 12.

Seniors



Counselors visited American Government/Economic classes in early October. Seniors received transcripts and received information about graduation requirements and college applications. To be “on track” for graduation, seniors should have a minimum of 160 credits. If seniors currently have 160 credits, they need 70 more to meet the 230-credit requirement for graduation, which means being enrolled in 7 classes. In mid/late November, parents of seniors will receive an individual letter from their child’s counselor that analyzes the graduation status of their student.

Unfortunately, Adult School is no longer offering “credit recovery” classes and LHS students are therefore not able to attend Adult School to make up credits. It is imperative that seniors pass classes both semesters. Failing a class may jeopardize graduation in May.

Counselors have prepared three booklets to help seniors prepare for college. One focuses on seniors who will apply to 4-year colleges, another booklet for seniors who plan to attend a community college, and a third booklet that summarizes financial aid information. Seniors may pick up these booklets in the Educational Planning Center.

LHS Counselors and the Educational Planning Center have prepared an informational sheet that was distributed to seniors during counselor visits. It includes information about career planning, college applications, and financial aid. Parents may also

Juniors Who Plan to Apply to 4-year Colleges

Juniors should go online to www.collegeboard.com and/or www.act.org and make plans for taking SAT and/or ACT in the spring. Both web sites provide practice tests and test strategies. All 4-year colleges require the SAT Reasoning Test or ACT. Juniors should plan ahead so they finish college testing by the end of the year.

Sophomores

This is the first year of a student’s “College GPA.” Although freshman courses count toward meeting the a – g requirements, a student’s College GPA starts sophomore year. All classes preceded by a (P) beginning sophomore year are counted in a student’s College GPA. It is important, even for strong academic students, to get help with classes if needed.

Sophomore grades are very important when students hope to enroll in AP classes junior year. Most advanced classes taken junior year require A and B grades from sophomore year.

Freshmen

Freshman year provides a foundation for academic success. Students should monitor grades and take advantage of after-school tutoring if they need help. Developing solid study skills is crucial. Creating a consistent homework schedule is one of the most important skills freshmen develop. The classes a student will be able to take sophomore year are often influenced by the grades a student gets freshman year.

Counselors will be visiting freshman English classes in late early November. We’ll review graduation/college requirements and discuss ways to be more successful in high school. Freshmen will also receive an informational handout with important resources.
